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EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

December 1, 2023, marked 50 years of providing services that strengthen families and community! Although our services have changed over the decades, what hasn't changed is our commitment to improving the quality of lives of the those we are here to serve. What has also remained constant for 50 years, is the commitment to developing strong teams to deliver impactful services and programs.

In 2023, St. Aidan's Society introduced our new Age Well At Home Program and 3 new team members. With generous funding from the Federal Government, we were able to implement a program that allows seniors to age at home while receiving the wrap around supports needed. This innovative program complements our existing Outreach, Link and Volunteer Programs and enhances the range of front-line services we offer. Our Community Strategist is central to realizing our vision that older adults experience improved quality of life as they age. With the provision of education, awareness and advocacy initiatives, this focus on creating high level change ensures we are creating a community that is more inclusive, age friendly, and supportive of older adults.

Volunteers are integral to our success and impact. Since the introduction of the program in 2021, we have expanded our volunteer-based service delivery to include large groups of volunteers that help us achieve our goals. The Regional Emergency Services Team at the RMWB and the Suncares Teams through Suncor Energy have been instrumental in providing manpower hours that allow us to undertake several large initiatives. A new partnership with the team at Re/Max will be a cornerstone of the Age Well At Home Program. As always, our one-to-one matches remain the foundation of our Volunteer Program. We are privileged to have so many incredible community members who generously give their time to improve senior quality of life.

Outreach

Outreach is a core service of St. Aidan's Society. Professional assessments are completed and support plans developed to ensure seniors have the services and support they require to meet

their unique needs. Seniors are continuously supported through a case management model so they experience improved quality of life.

Link Program

Our Link Workers use a 'wrap around' approach of service connection to ensure older adults are fully connected to the necessary community

resources. Connecting seniors to social programs, assisting with financial benefits and providing referrals for transportation and housing programs helps keep them engaged in community life. Our Link Workers also connect seniors to the in-home support services necessary to help them age at home. The Link Worker refers more complex concerns to the Outreach team as part of our internal social prescribing network.

Ensuring seniors are honoured and recognized is an important outcome for the team at St. Aidan's. Since 2016, St. Aidan's has hosted a VIP Movie Event where seniors are invited to be treated like royalty--escorted to their seats by a team of volunteer emergency service staff, seniors enjoy a free movie, popcorn, pop and chocolate bar. It is a favourite event for the seniors and our team loves it too!

Senior Health & Wellness

The 60+ Health & Wellness Series is designed to provide education and awareness of available resources and supports for the older adult population. The sessions have an added benefit of creating and encouraging social connections. Some examples of workshops hosted in 2023 include: Importance of Stretching, Falls Prevention, Estate Planning, Grief and Loss and Heart Health.

The Staying Active, Staying program, hosted in partnership with the RRC, invited seniors of all abilities to a series of adaptive golf sessions followed by the "19th hole" social gathering. Carpet Bowling and the Ageless & Unstoppable Programs continue to keep seniors active and moving.
